## VETERAN'S RESIDENCY AFFIDAVIT

The original, signed, and notarized document must be submitted. Faxes, scans, or photocopies of this completed form are not accepted.

## Eligibility for certain State of Wisconsin benefits offered under Ch. 45

Sections 45.02(2)(a-c) Wis. Stats., require an eligible veteran to be a current resident of Wisconsin and currently living in Wisconsin, and either have been a resident of Wisconsin at the time of entry into active service or to have been a Wisconsin resident for any consecutive 12-month period after entry or reentry into service.

# **Veterans and Surviving Spouses Property Tax Credit**

Section 71.07(6e)(a)3.b., Wis. Stats., requires an eligible veteran to either have been a resident of Wisconsin at the time of entry into active service or to have been a Wisconsin resident for a consecutive 5-year period after entry into that service. Section 71.07(6e)(a)3.c., Wis. Stats., also requires the eligible veteran to be a current resident of Wisconsin for purposes of receiving benefits under Chapter 45 of the Wisconsin statutes.

## Wisconsin G.I. Bill

Section 36.27(3p)(a)1r. and Section 38.24(8)(a)1r., Wis. Stats., require an eligible veteran to either have been a resident of Wisconsin at the time of entry into active service or to have been a Wisconsin resident for at least 5 consecutive years immediately preceding the beginning of any semester or session for which the person registers at a participating institution. These statutes also require the eligible veteran to be a current resident of Wisconsin for purposes of receiving benefits under Chapter 45 of the Wisconsin statutes.

To change legal residence, a servicemember must do all of the following:

- Have a physical presence in a new locality.
- Have an intent to remain there permanently or indefinitely and take actions that show that intent.
- Have an intent to abandon the servicemember's old legal residence and take actions that show that intent.

To be considered a "resident" of Wisconsin, an individual must have taken an affirmative action to become a Wisconsin resident, such as voting in Wisconsin, filing Wisconsin state income taxes as a Wisconsin **resident**, obtaining a Wisconsin Driver's License or state-issued Identification Card (issued after 2007) and relinquishing the driver's license of the other state, obtaining a Wisconsin resident hunting or fishing license from the state department of natural resources, or attaining proof of resident status for tuition purposes at University of Wisconsin or Wisconsin Technical College institution. At least **ONE** of the following documents may be used to demonstrate an affirmative act as a Wisconsin resident:

- Wisconsin voting record showing you voted in Wisconsin.
- Wisconsin state income tax return filed as a "resident".
- Valid unexpired Wisconsin Driver's License or state-issued Identification Card (issued after 2007).
- Statement of Driver's License history on official DMV letterhead.
- Wisconsin DNR "resident" hunting or fishing license.
- Proof of resident status for tuition purposes at University of Wisconsin or Wisconsin Technical College Institution as reflected on University of Wisconsin or Wisconsin Technical College letterhead.
- Recognition of residency status by a unit of Wisconsin state government.

Moving from one duty station to another does not by itself constitute a change in legal residence. Owning property or living in Wisconsin without having taken an affirmative act to establish Wisconsin "residency" as mentioned above would NOT qualify an individual as a "resident" for benefit purposes. By completing this form, the veteran attests that each one of the previously mentioned residency forms of proof are unobtainable. By completing this form, the veteran is attesting this affidavit is the last resort to prove Wisconsin "residency."

If a service member is currently on active duty, that does NOT automatically satisfy the Wisconsin "residency" requirement for benefit purposes. A servicemember who is a legal resident of another state and who enters the armed forces remains a legal resident of that state unless affirmative action is taken by the servicemember to abandon residency of that state and establish legal residency in Wisconsin.

This WDVA 1805 form may only be completed by a veteran to attest their own residency and may not be completed by anyone other than the veteran to attest the veteran's residency.

If other evidence is received or discovered that contradicts any information provided on this affidavit, the affidavit is automatically invalidated, and no further veteran's residency affidavits (WDVA 1805) will be accepted from the veteran.

Section 71.07(6e)(a)3.c., Wis. Stats., also requires the eligible veteran to be a current resident of Wisconsin for purposes of receiving benefits under Chapter 45 of the Wisconsin statutes.
